Code	Restrictions	Notes
Black/dark grey/navy blue blazer OR a black/dark grey/navy blue suit	Single colour and smart. Suit jackets must be worn with matching trousers/skirt/dress.	
Black/dark grey/navy blue tailored trousers/skirt/dress	<p>Skirts or dresses must be at least knee length and suitable for a professional environment.</p> <p>No lycra, denim or leggings permitted.</p> <p>Trousers must be full length and not cropped.</p>	
Jumpers/cardigans must be V-necked/round-necked and plain black/grey/navy blue in colour.		
<p>Shirts/blouses/tops must be appropriate for the working day. They must be formal in appearance.</p> <p>They can be white/coloured, and either plain or with a discrete stripe or check.</p>	Shirts are to be of non-shiny material. Very bright colours are not permitted. No vest tops, crop tops, off the-shoulder or low-cut tops.	
Badges and lanyards	Prefects must always wear their Prefect badge. All other students must wear the Sixth Form lanyard or any other badge may be worn to which the student is entitled, for instance Half-House, Full-House. College Colours or Representative Honours (with approval of the Head of Sixth Form) are acceptable.	



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Coats must be plain black, navy or dark grey.		
Shoes must be black/dark brown/navy blue and polishable.	No white socks or trainers. Tights, if worn, must be plain and natural or dark in colour.	
Jewellery, make up and nail varnish, if worn, must be discreet. One stud earring in each earlobe is permitted.	Rings, medals, chains, bracelets, badges, other earrings, spacers, tattoos and smart watches are not permitted.	It is advised not to wear expensive wrist watches to college.
Hair should be neat, tidy and clean.	<p>Extreme hairstyle, for example, very short hair, undercuts or layered hair, even if temporarily fashionable, are not permitted, nor obviously coloured or excessively styled hair. Lines and patterns are not to be cut into the hair.</p> <p>Short hair is to be no less than a 3 cut. Long hair to be tied back for practical subjects.</p>	The College is sensitive to the dictates of religious culture and will consider written requests regarding exemptions.
