The charism of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart is a gift from God to the Church. Our predecessors made us heirs of this charism through their devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As members of a College community striving to embody this charism, our primary mission is the evangelization of young people. Today we draw our inspiration from a spirituality of love expressed in the Gospel and lived through the compassion of Christ.
